Interesting Facts

- ❖ There are 4 chapters, 83 verses, and 1666 words, and the average reader can read the book in about 11 minutes.
- ❖ The book was written by Paul from his last Roman imprisonment around 67 AD.
- ❖ We learn insights into the whereabouts and state of some of Paul’s co-workers near the close of his life.
- ❖ It appears from the statement about desire for special things left in Troas (evidently suddenly) that it was there that Paul was arrested.
- ❖ Timothy’s name is found in more epistles than any other.
- ❖ Paul seems confident that his example and circumstances can be an encouragement for Timothy to remain faithful despite impending persecution and the terrible state of the worlds future degradation.
